Norquist has made a career out of overturning conventional political thinking: *“I believe cities add value to civilization.”* Strategies require thinking outside the box – way outside the box. From his perspective, federally funded highways and housing policies have led only to the decline of big cities – encouraging suburban sprawl at the expense of healthy urban centers.

Norquist is not in favor of one-way streets in downtowns. Why? *“Retail will do better, your buildings value will be higher and it makes downtown more of a destination, instead of a place you blow in and blow out of very quickly.”* *“You need parking if you want retail on the streets downtown. If you don’t have the parking spots, people won’t stop. Adding parking spaces downtown on the streets is a big plus – It’s a great way to add value to your downtown without spending money.”*
