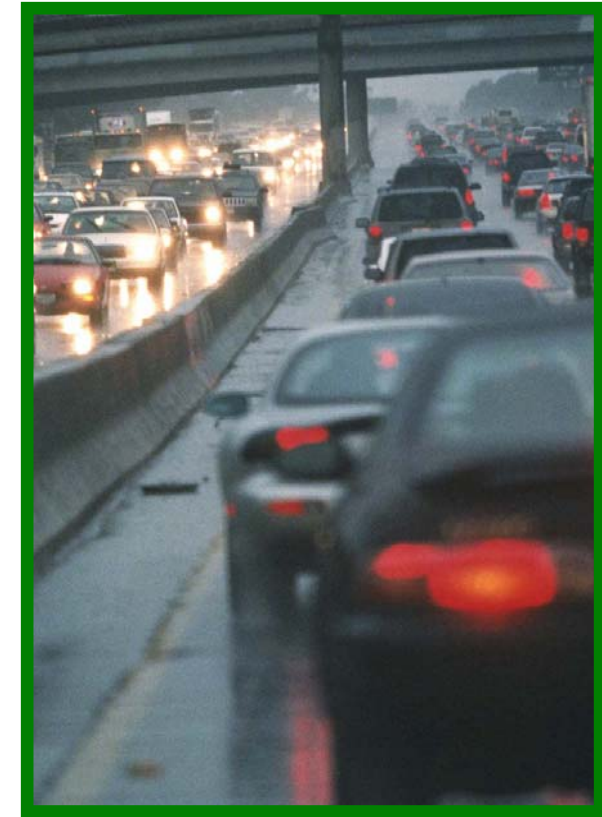
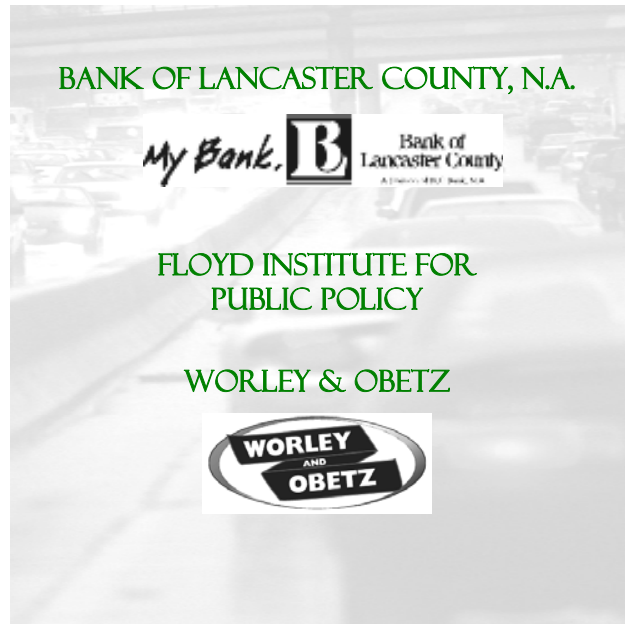

Allen D. Biehler



Allen Biehler is the Pennsylvania Secretary of Transportation. Secretary Biehler has over 35 years of public and private sector experience in transportation engineering, planning, construction administration and public transportation management. He has written articles for national transportation professional journals and served on committees of the Transportation Research Board and the American Public Transportation Association. Walter M. Kulash



Walter Kulash is a traffic engineer and community-planning consultant based in Orlando. He is a nationally recognized leader in livable traffic design, which argues against the conventional approach to traffic congestion. Mr. Kulash believes that adding capacity to move more vehicles at higher speeds, not only doesn't work, it makes the problem worse. He advocates a more inclusive view of traffic and street design – from traffic performance to economic impact to public safety to quality of life – where effective redesign can calm traffic and change motorist behavior.
